## A Word from Pastor Scott

*"To Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, mercy, and peace  
from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord."*

### 2 Timothy 1:2

Here we go! **Summer D-Groups** start this week. I hope you'll join us. This summer's study will focus on the Apostle Paul's final letter to Timothy (2 Tim) This is Paul's "swan song," his final brief word of encouragement written to his dear friend and disciple, Timothy, just before being executed for Christ in Rome. Imagine you could write one final letter to those you love to let them know what truly matters to you and to urge them on in faithfulness to Christ. What would you write. 2 Timothy is what Paul wrote, and it is truly powerful.

So I hope you can join one of our groups starting this week (info below). But even if you can't, let me encourage you to join in reading 2 Timothy this summer. Lord willing, I'll send out study questions each week to help us think through what Paul has written. For this week's questions, let me urge you to read the whole book (in one sitting if possible) and answer the following:

- (1)What is Paul's situation as he writes this letter?
- (2)What do we learn about Timothy from this letter?
- (3)Why do you think Paul wrote this letter to Timothy?
- (4)How would you describe the mood of Paul of this letter? Afraid? Happy?
- (5)What does Paul hope Timothy will do once he himself is gone?
- (6) What do you think is the overall theme of the letter?
- (7) What can we learn from this letter?

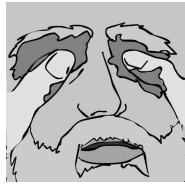
