Why Should I Be Baptized?

Baptism is commanded by Christ (Matthew 28:18-20) for all those who would follow Him as disciples. It is a picture on the outside of what Christ does on the inside of all those who come to Him by faith. As Paul declares in Romans 6:4, "We are buried with Him through baptism into death, and raised to walk in newness of life." Baptism, therefore symbolizes our new life in Christ as believers. It is a public declaration that my old life is dead and I now belong to him. As such, it is the first act of obedience for all who would profess their faith in Him for salvation. Memorizing Scripture! Each week's '*Fighter Verse*' is meant to help you "fight the good fight" of faith. It would be worthwhile to memorize the whole passage from this morning's message, **2 Thessalonians 3:5**

2 Thessalonians 3:1-5

5 May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ.

"Prayers and Faithfulness for the Path Ahead" **(2 Thessalonians 3:1-5)**

- I. We must pray for the Lord's word to _____ and _____ through His heralds, and for those heralds to be rescued (3:1-2).
 - A. We must pray that the Lord's word would spread rapidly and be glorified through His heralds as it did among _____ (v.1; cf. Acts 17:1-9; 1 Thess.; 2 Thess. 1:3-4, 10; 2:13).
 - B. We must pray that the Lord's heralds be rescued from wicked and evil men, because _____ (v.2).

- II. Because the Lord is _____, we will be established and guarded, and we can have confidence in the Lord about obedience (3:3-4).
 - A. Although evil men do not have faith and attempt to destroy ours, our faithful Lord will establish us (v. 3).
 - B. The faithful Lord will guard us against Satan (v. 3).
 - C. Confidence in the faithful Lord brings _____ of obedience—now and later (v.4).

- III. We are led into obedience by the Lord _____ our hearts (3:5).
 - A. Paul prayed that the Thessalonians' hearts would be directed in two ways:
 - 1. That their hearts would be directed into God's love.
 - 2. That their hearts would be directed into Christ's _____ (cf. Isa. 50).
 - B. By being directed into God's love and Christ's steadfastness, this produces love _____ God and steadfastness _____ Christ.
 - C. To glorify the Lord's word, let us make this prayer our own.

A Word from Pastor Scott: Sunday May 22, 2022

"For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it?"

Luke 14:28

The point of this verse from Luke 14 really has nothing with economics. Jesus is talking about the cost of discipleship. In the verse just before this one he says, "Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Following Jesus requires a full time commitment. There can be no "part time" discipleship. You are either all in, or you are not in at all.

And yet this statement from Jesus does build on a principle of wisdom. You don't just jump into a big project. You take your time. You calculate the cost. You consider before beginning whether you will be able to finish.

As we begin the process of considering what to do with our building and our need for space, we are now in the preliminary stage of preparing to count the cost. No decision has yet been made, except to begin looking at our options. Toward that end, the church approved the money needed for a preliminary report that will tell us what we are able to build on this property. Since then, we have found that we must gather a bit more information before such a report can be generated. Our plan is to ask them to look at three possible options.

Option #1 – Build a sanctuary big enough for 400 to 500 people and then remodel the current building for classes and fellowship hall. (Most expensive)

Option #2 – Remodel the current sanctuary for maximum seating by moving the offices and library to a small office building with a few extra classes. Remodel the basement to double as fellowship hall and classes. (Less expensive)

Option #3 – Something in between these two options is being considered.

We are just getting started. As we gather the necessary information, we may be calling on our various members with experience in building to help us. Please be patient, as this may take a while. And please be in prayer.

We will keep you informed as things progress.
