How to Join Rockport Baptist Church

Why Should I Be Baptized?

Baptism is commanded by Christ (Matthew 28:18-20) for all those who would follow Him as disciples. As Paul declares in Romans 6:4, "We are buried with Him through baptism into death, and raised to walk in newness of life." Baptism, therefore symbolizes our new life in Christ as believers. It is a public declaration that my old life is dead and I now belong to him. As such, it is the first act of obedience for all who would profess their faith in Him for salvation. #### "Sight & Blindness" 2 Kings 6:8-24

Background - Israel during the time of Elijah and Elisha

- I. God \_\_\_\_\_ His enemies' plans and \_\_\_\_\_ His people (6:8-10).
  - A. The enemies of God's people plot to attack and defeat them (6:8).
  - B. God warns of attack through His messenger speaking His prophetic Word (6:9).
- C. Listening to God's warnings through the prophet repeatedly \_\_\_\_\_ Israel's king (6:10).
- II. Despite seeing His power, the Lord's \_\_\_\_\_\_ enemies continue to plot to silence His word and to destroy His people (6:11-14).
  - A. God's intervention angered Syria's king and compelled him to believe there was a \_\_\_\_\_ among them (6:11).
  - B. Israel's prophet knows and tells what the Syrian king says \_\_\_\_\_ (6:12).
  - C. The Syrian king, undeterred by the Lord's repeated thwarting of his plans, sends an army to capture God's prophet (6:13-14).
- III. \_\_\_\_\_ the Lord of hosts outnumber and capture His enemies (6:15-19)!
  - A. The prophet's servant \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ the Syrian army (6:15).
  - B. Elisha, however, sees that the Lord's army outnumbers the enemy's, and, through God's provision, Elisha's servant sees as well (6:16-17).
  - C. God blinds the Syrian army so they cannot see their \_\_\_\_(6:18-19).
- IV. Seeing God's mercy should motivate His enemies and His people to abandon their \_\_\_\_\_\_ (6:20-24; 2 Kgs. 6:24-17:21).
  - A. God causes the Syrian army to see that they have been \_\_\_\_\_\_ and are at His \_\_\_\_\_\_ (6:20-21).
  - B. Seeing God's mercy yet still spiritually blind, the Syrian army goes home and returns later with greater force (6:22-24).
  - C. Israel also does not truly see God's mercy to them, and their leads them away from God and their land (2 Kgs. 6:24-17:21).

"Come away... and rest a while"

#### Mark 6:31a

I don't know about you, but it feels like this summer has been a whirlwind of busy (not to mention crazy hot!).
