A Word from Pastor Warren Sunday April 2, 2023

"Blessed by the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead... In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials."

1 Peter 1:3, 6

The news of another, tragic school shooting this past Monday sent many of us reeling. Sadly, we have started to become numb to the horrors of such evil, but this one felt different for many of us. It felt closer to home. These were our people. Here, evil entered our safe spaces.

What is the appropriate reaction to a massacre like this? We see the sweet, smiling pictures of the victims and grieve with their families – imagining what it would be like to lose our little girl or our beloved grandpa. We observe how our godless society has turned right and wrong upside down, and we are angry. We reflect on cultural forces increasingly stoking flames of hatred, and we are afraid. We may even turn towards the young woman who committed these atrocities and feel some pity, knowing how her mind must have been twisted by sin and Satan to do such evil.

At some level, all of these responses are appropriate. All of these feelings are right. The meaningless destruction of lives by a twisted killer is heart-breaking. It is maddening. It is scary.

But it is not the final word. The hope that we have, the hope that Peter celebrates, is a hope that returns from the dead – just like Jesus did.

The reality is no space is safe. We will be grieved by various trials. But, in Christ, we are never in danger. He gives us an indestructible hope. It is a hope that is "imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." (1 Pe 1:4b-5)

In the meantime, don't presume on tomorrow. Hug your kids close today. Share the gospel today. Come to Jesus today. Receive the hope he gives. We are not promised tomorrow – but we are promised forever!
