As Paul declares in Romans 6:4, "We are buried with Him through baptism into death, and raised to walk in newness of life." Baptism, therefore symbolizes our new life in Christ as believers. It is a public declaration that my old life is dead and I now belong to him. As such, it is the first act of obedience for all who would profess their faith in Him for salvation. A Word from Pastor Scott: Sunday May 14, 2023

Brothers, pray for us. 1 Thess 5:25

As you read these words, I will be in the little Gypsy village of Zizin, Romania preaching at an evangelistic event. So why am I there? And what is our church's connection to Zizin? For nearly 20 years we have worked with several HeartCry supported missionaries in Romania. Among these are our friends Sorin and Trish Prodan, Alex and Simona Palada, and Ian and Ani Tomoci. They have visited us here and I and a few others have had the privilege of visiting them in Romania. All three couples are now a part of Providence Church in Brasov, Romania from which they minister. So that about Zizin?

A few years ago God laid it on the hearts of our friends to plant a church among the gypsies who live in Zizin a few miles outside of Brasov. With the help of HeartCry they began to share the Gospel with the people, and before long a church began. However, when they started to look for property to rent, they discovered there wasn't much available, and what was available was not open to them because of religious prejudice (Romania is traditionally an Eastern Orthodox country). And when they sought property to purchase, they found that it was far too expensive. Since Romania joined the EU, prices have increased dramatically, even though salaries have not.

But by the grace of God, we were able to help connect our brother Scott Larson and a missions funding organization he is part of with the work in Zizin. God worked it out so that land was purchased and a building built that will meet their needs for years to come. Scott and I have been invited to help them celebrate the grand opening and see the work God has begun.

So pray for the little church in Zizin. And pray for us. Pray also for Warren as he preaches here at Rockport today and for our brothers who will preach over the next few weeks: Jason Woelm (5/21) and Eric Bird (5/28).
