From the Heidleberg Catechism (Part III)

<u>Pastor</u>: The Bible says, "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. . . . There is none righteous, not even one!" So did God create people this way, with a wicked and perverse nature?

<u>Congregation</u>: No, God made mankind good, in His own image and likeness.

- P: If God made man good, with a righteousness desire to know and walk with God in true holiness, Then what happened? Where does our corrupt human nature come from?
- C: Mankind fell into sin through the disobedience of our first parents, Adam and Eve. Their fall into sin so poisoned our nature that we are sinful from birth.
- **P**: But are we so corrupted by sin that we are totally unable to do any good and wholly inclined toward all evil?
- C: Yes, the Bible makes it clear, apart from the new birth we are incapable of doing any good toward God.
- P: Romans 3:10-12 says, as it is written: "None is righteous, no, not one; No one understands; no one seeks for God. All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one."
