A Word from Pastor Scott: Sunday December 31, 2023

Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen. **2 Peter 3:18**

The rush and hurry of the holiday season is all but done. The only thing left is the less-than-exciting task of cleaning up the mess, taking down the tree, packing away the decorations, and letting things start to get back to "normal." But what does "normal" mean for a follower of Christ?

Certainly the world will pack "the baby Jesus" away in a box with tissue paper and not give him another thought 'til November. But we can't do that! For us the presence of Christ is not limited to a season of temporary "peace and good will" before we jump back to "real" life. For us presence of Christ <u>is</u> real life as we seek Him daily! The holidays are only the beginning of a whole year filled with the grace, mercy and love from the One we know is worthy of our praise, adoration and obedience daily.

So my prayer for you and all our church family as we enter the New Year is that it really will be a year of new beginnings as we seek to grow together in the knowledge, fellowship and love of Christ! (2 Pet 3:18). But if we are to do so, let me remind you that a life centered on Christ does not happen by accident. A Word from Pastor Warren

Sunday, December 31, 2023

"I will meditate on your precepts and fix my eyes on your ways. I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your Word." Psalm 119:15-16

There are many good resolutions to make as we start a new year, but one of the most important ones we hope you will make is a fresh commitment to the regular, personal, Bible reading in 2024. Every day we face temptations to be conformed to this world, so every day we need to be transformed by the renewing of our minds (Rom 12:2). The Holy Spirit does this work of mental transformation through God's Word. What should this regular Bible intake look like? That will look different for each person. But every Christian can benefit from Donald Whitney's three-fold advice: 1) Find the time 2) Find a plan 3) Find a word/phrase/verse to meditate on. Some will have time to set aside an hour for study and prayer. Others may listen to an audio Bible on a morning commute or catch snatches while the babies nap. The important thing is that you have a plan. If you aim at nothing, you'll hit it every time. Our plans will differ in when and where, but they will also differ in how we approach Bible reading. Martin Luther recommended reading through the whole Bible every year "to keep the winds of the whole blowing through [your] mind" (HT R.C. Sproul). Especially if you've never done it, that broad exposure may be particularly helpful to you.

Others, however, find they get more with a slower pace that gives room to stop and smell the roses. Our goal is not merely to get through the Bible, but have the Bible get through to us. You may simply want to put a bookmark in one place and read the next section each day.

Whether you are reading fast or slow, read expectantly, trusting God to meet you in His Word. Look for something to take with you, a word or phrase to meditate on that day and put into practice.
