So where are we in our process of considering how we can provide the additional space our congregation needs? As most of you know, we have asked our Building Finance Team to continue the process of looking into the options available to us to be able to fund construction of a new auditorium/worship center. They are taking stock of the funds we have on hand and trying to get a clear handle on (a) how much we can reasonably expect to borrow and (b) how much we should be able to raise through a capital campaign within our church. One resource we are exploring for this process is to secure the help and experience of Bro John Hessel, a former pastor and church stewardship consultant who has helped many churches navigate this process. Several of us have known John for more than 30 years since John served as the interim pastor of Rockport in the year of transition between the previous pastor, Tommy Chapman, and my becoming pastor in 1991. John's goal is to help churches like ours assess what they can do financially and then prayerfully put together a Capital Stewardship Campaign as a way to lead the congregation in giving. John has been invited to join us this afternoon following a fellowship meal to explain what he does and answer any question you may have. After that, we will call the church to two weeks of prayer before asking you to affirm the proposal that we hire John as our consultant.

At the same time, we will be asking our Building Design Team to consider what modifications may be necessary to bring our proposed building in line with our finances. Please pray as they do their work. Ask the Lord to help us be wise in determining (1) what we are able to build to provide space for our congregation, and (2) how we can be faithful in raising the funds we need.

Seeking Him and His Wisdom in this process.

Why Should I Be Baptized?
