A Word from Pastor Scott:

Sunday, February 25, 2024

"Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer."

Romans 12:12

I was glad to see so many of you stick around last Sunday to hear our friend John Hessel share with us what it would mean for our church to begin a Capital Campaign as we seek to raise the money needed for a new worship facility. There were a lot of good questions asked and, no doubt, there will be more as we continue to seek wisdom and work through this process. With that in mind, let me share some thoughts about where we are in that process.

We know that we need to provide space, first for worship, then for education and fellowship, but worship is our first priority. We have asked our building team to consider how we might revise our original plans in order to keep the project total closer to \$1.8 million as a more reasonable goal for what we can afford. But in actually, we will not know what we are *able* to afford until we begin the Capital Campaign, which is why it must come first, even before the specific plans for the building have been worked out. A Capital Campaign will give us a much clearer idea of the funds we will have to work with through the anticipated giving of our congregation. Only when we have that number in hand can we move forward with specific plans for what we can build. The last thing we need to do is wait until later in the process to discover that we have overestimated (or even under-estimated) what we have to work with. Doing that would ultimately cost even more in time and expense.

With that in mind, we will be asking you to affirm the following at our next congregation meeting scheduled for Sunday, March 17th after church/meal.

- 1. That we move forward with our plans to provide needed worship space
- 2. That we contract with John Hessel to help with a Capital Campaign to determine the projected amount we can expect through the giving of our congregation as we enter the design phase for a building.

ROCKPORT CHURCH COVENANT

Believing that the pursuit of peace with others and personal holiness accompanies true faith in Christ, we engage to watch over one another in brotherly love; to remember one another in prayer; to help one another in sickness and distress; and to cultivate Christian compassion and courtesy.

We will be slow to take offense, always eager to seek the reconciliation that Christ commands, being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

We resolve to practice personal and family worship, and to train our children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

We promise that when we leave this church we will diligently seek to unite with another church of like faith where we can continue to carry out the spirit and principles of God's Word.
