How to Join Rockport Baptist Church

(Romans 10:9-10)
- (2) Obedience to Christ through water baptism
(Matthew 28:18-20)
- (3) A willing commitment to the basic beliefs and practices of this church as evidenced in our Confession of Faith and Church Covenant (available upon request)

Those who are interested in seeking membership are asked to make this known to Pastor Scott and/or an Elder who will provide a copy of our Petition for Membership and explain the process.

Why Should I Be Baptized?

Baptism is commanded by Christ (Matthew 28:18-20) for all those who would follow Him as disciples. It is a picture on the outside of what Christ does on the inside of all those who come to Him by faith. As Paul declares in Romans 6:4, "We are buried with Him through baptism into death, and raised to walk in newness of life." Baptism, therefore symbolizes our new life in Christ as believers. It is a public declaration that my old life is dead and I now belong to him. As such, it is the first act of obedience for all who would profess their faith in Him for salvation. 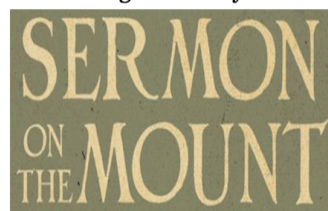

A Word from Pastor Scott:

Sunday February 4, 2024

"Jesus came and said to them, "All Authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me, therefore go and make disciples of all nations . . . "

Matthew 28:18-19a

Anybody who knows me, knows that I really do not like to step away from a verse by verse series like the one we just began in Galatians in order to do anything else! In fact, nothing would please me more than to be able to continue that with study this morning. That's because we are committed to the regular verse by verse exposition of Scripture as the main way we engage the Word of God week to week here at Rockport. That's something that will not change. However, there are times when it becomes necessary for us to step away from our normal approach to the study of Scripture to focus on an important topic from a biblical point of view. That's where we find ourselves this morning.

Beginning today we will engage in a four week series that grows out of our recent elder's retreat as we joined together to seek the Lord and His wisdom for our church. As we thought about where we are as a body, and the decisions we need to make about our future growth and faithfulness to Christ, we became convinced that it would be important for us to take the time to re-center our church on it's God-given mission in order to gain a clearer understanding of who we are as Rockport Baptist Church and why it matters that we not lose sight of this core mission. With that in mind, we will spend the next four Sundays looking at "*Who We are As Christ's Church and Why It Matters*." The messages in this series will focus on the following:

- 2/4 *Who We Are and Why It Matters: Our Mission as Christ's Church*
- 2/11 *Who We Are and What We Do: Our Values as Christ's Church*
- 2/18 *Who We Are Becoming: Change and the Growth of Christ's Church*
- 2/25 *Who We are and What We Pursue to be Faithful as Christ's Church*

Deacon Selection

Next week, you will be asked to nominate men to serve as deacons. As a reminder, the biblical qualifications for deacons may be found in **Acts 6:3** and **1 Timothy 3:8-13**.

Acts 6:3 (possibly refers to deacons)

Therefore, brothers, pick out from among you seven men of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we will appoint to this duty.

1 Timothy 3:8-13

Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. ⁹ They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. ¹⁰ And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. ¹¹ Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. ¹² Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. ¹³ For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.

For further guidance, our constitution defines the office and responsibility of deacons as follows:

Section 4 - Deacons The Deacons exist to serve the physical and fellowship needs of the Church. The Bible teaches that the deacons may consist of those qualified men whom the church duly elects to serve in this capacity.

A) The Office of Deacon. The office of deacon is described in 1 Timothy 3:8-13 and Acts 6:1-7. The church shall recognize, in accordance with the constitutional provisions on elections, men who are giving of themselves in service to the church, who possess gifts of leadership, and who are called to further service. These members shall be received as gifts of Christ to His church and set apart as deacons. The number of deacons shall be determined by the needs of the ministry and by the call and qualification of men in the church.

B) The Responsibilities of the Deacons . The deacons shall advise and be ready to assist the elders in any service that shall support and promote the ministry of the Word, new and existing ministries of the church, and the care for the members of the congregation.

Their responsibilities shall include but are not limited to:

1. administering a fund to assist the poor and needy and otherwise providing aid in times of crisis or distress;
2. the greeting and welcoming ministries of the church;
3. assisting in administering the ordinances of the Gospel;
4. assisting at fellowship gatherings of the church;
5. visiting and ministering to the needs of the sick and shut-in and especially widows;
6. helping maintain compassionate contact with those members who seem to be in danger of falling out of active fellowship with our congregation.
7. serving as members of the Stewardship Committee to oversee the finances of the church
8. oversee the Building and Grounds (Properties) Committee for maintenance of church property

It is our prayer to see the Lord raise up additional qualified men to serve along with our current body of deacons. Once candidates have been identified, we will meet with them to determine their qualifications and willingness to serve. Following that, we will present the church with the names of nominees to prayerfully consider and affirm later this Spring.
