## **A Word from Pastor Warren:**

**Sunday, June 2, 2024**

"Above all you shall keep my Sabbaths, for this is a sign between me and you...that you may know that I, the LORD, sanctify you."  
Exodus 31:13

No, I am not taking Pastor Scott being out of town as an opportunity to push some law on you. Your pastors are united in understanding that, for those who are in Christ, "we are not under law but under grace." (Rom 6:15) This is a glorious truth that actually leads us into the true sabbath rest described in the fourth chapter of Hebrews. "There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works." (Heb 4:9-10a)

The sabbaths of the OT law taught the people of Israel by their practice and teach us by their example that our lives (spiritual and physical) do not ultimately rest on our labors. It is the LORD who sanctifies us. He sets us apart for salvation. He sets us apart for life.

I have sabbath and rest on my mind because we are hitting summer. Many of us will try to take some time off for some r&r, but many who do will fail to rest or recuperate.

We are not very good at rest. Despite our technology training us to be more passive and sedentary, we are driven by anxieties that everything hangs on us. Yet this self-focused anxiety is not a uniquely modern or American tendency. It is a universal human problem. Solomon pointed it out in Ps 127:2, "It is vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil, for he gives to his beloved sleep."

This verse does not mean God doesn't love you if you struggle with insomnia. It does mean that God's beloved people can rest in the confidence that our Father knows our needs and will provide for us – even as he has already provided everything for us in Jesus Christ.

If you are taking some time off this summer, I hope you will rest well. You have work to do in this life, but your life does not ultimately depend on your work. Your Father will continue to take care of you.
