A Word from Pastor Scott:

Sunday, July 28, 2024

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 19:14

Some of the things I truly love about our HeartCry missionary friend Alex Palada from Romania are (1) his deep commitment to prayer; (2) his unflagging zeal for evangelism; and (3) his compassion toward children, especially those who have never heard the gospel of Christ. These three things came together a few years ago when Alex went to visit a new Believer in the little village of Zizin. When he got there he saw great poverty, both physical and spiritual. The people were very poor with many needs, and there was no solid, biblical church sharing the hope of the Gospel with them. Alex began to walk the streets of Zizin, praying and speaking with the people. Before long there was a small group meeting who quickly outgrew the tiny home they were meeting in. And there were children, so many children on the streets, growing up in poverty, exposed to many sins and without any knowledge of Christ.

Alex and his wife Simona began to take regular trips to Zizin. They were soon joined by another brother, Emanuel Ivan and his wife Camy. With the support of HeartCry and the Larson Foundation, a church building was built (the one Scott Larson and I visited last year). It's a beautiful work that is bearing good fruit, especially among the children of the village where girls are often pregnant by the age of 13-15 and boys easily fall into a life of crime.

That's one reason ministry to children has been a big part of the work in Zizin, with regular after-school classes and summer outreaches. In August, the little mission will be conducting a VBS outreach in the village. They have asked if we could help finance it. By God's providence, we already have funds set aside in an old account originally set up to help Bro Alex with various outreach projects. We are sending them \$1000 to cover this project. So pray for Zizin!
