

A Word from Pastor Warren Sunday, April 13, 2025

"...And the word of God continued to increase, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem..."

Acts 6:7a

Growth is hard. Some of you read that and think, "What are you talking about? Growth is exciting! Growth is life!" And you're right. But growth is hard too.

It's hard when the bathroom queue is long. It's hard when the need for systems and structure threatens to displace the organic feel that has always characterized our Rockport family. It's hard when classes or ministries you have treasured are put on pause. It's hard when you feel your church no longer has room for you.

That feeling is not figurative. Finding seats on Sunday morning is increasingly difficult. Some of you have already had weeks when you've had to settle for the overflow room. As God continues to bring people to our church who are hungry for God's Word, this "problem" will likely get worse before it gets better. Can I encourage you with a couple reminders while we wait, pray, and look for God to give us a bigger space?

First, God is at work. It is his idea to grow his church. Is it any wonder that, as Rockport has sought to be faithful, genuine believers are drawn to celebrate Jesus with us? The things you treasure about Rockport are things others love too: 1) Truth that transforms lives 2) Gospel-rich worship 3) Spirit-fueled fellowship 4) Prayerful dependence 5) Christ-exalting mission. These are signs of health – and healthy things tend to grow.

Second, you are not interchangeable. As groups grow, it's easy to feel like a cog in a machine. But Rockport is not a machine; we are a body, a family. We need the faith of our long-term members. If you have been at Rockport for years (or decades!), you carry the DNA of our church and you carry the stories of God's faithfulness to us. Amid the churn of change and influx of visitors, your grace-filled rootedness is a gift – to your pastors, to the body, and to the world. Stay rooted, keep growing.
