A Word from Pastor Scott:

Sunday, June 8, 2025

“But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word.”

Acts 6:4

One of the callings your pastors take very seriously is the calling to **pray** regularly for you and your family. Indeed we believe that prayer, along with “the ministry of the word,” is essential to all pastoral ministry based on passages like Acts 6:4. Indeed, we believe that for us to neglect such prayer would be evidence that we are unfaithful shepherds. I often think of Samuel’s statement to the people of Israel in 1 Samuel 12:23 when he said, “far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by ceasing to pray for you.” That’s not a sin I want to be guilty of. With that in mind, your pastors begin each weekly elders’ meeting with a time of prayer for the people of our congregation. Our current practice is to focus on nine families each week, with each elder praying for three of those homes. We do this, not just as a duty, but as something that is a privilege and a calling for us to lift your names and those of your children to the Lord for his rich blessing, guidance, grace and peace to reign over your lives. If at any time you have *specific* requests you would like for us to bring before our Lord, please do not hesitate to let us know. It would truly be our joy.

Another important area of ministry is that of **biblical counseling**. As pastors, we take this call very seriously as well and always strive to give godly counsel from God’s word whenever we have opportunity to do so. Recently, the Lord has given us another resource in this regard. Our brother **Jonathan (PJ) Gunby** is in the final stages of training to be a **Certified Biblical Counselor**. As part of his training, he is looking for opportunities to offer such counsel to our people. If you are interested, please see one of the elders or talk to Jonathan directly. As a faithful brother, he has our full support as well as our heartfelt recommendation.

Pastor: *What shall we say then?*
