## **A Word from Pastor Scott:**

**Sunday, May 24, 2026**

*Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ,*

**Ephesians 4:15**

If you've been a part of Rockport for very long, you know that one of our foundational commitments is to the verse by verse exposition of Scripture. We believe that the best way to learn from God's Word is to read and study it as it was inspired by the Holy Spirit: verse by verse, line by line through the various books of the Bible. This does not mean there is no place for the occasional topical message, as long as that message is faithful to bring out what Scripture actually says. But our regular diet in this church is to go verse by verse and let God tell us through His word what He wants us to hear and understand.

One benefit of this approach is that it forces us to deal with passages that may be considered difficult or controversially, or that simply contain truths people today do not like to hear. When we come to such passages, our choice is pretty simple. We can either be faithful to deal with the topic as the God-inspired Scriptures give it for our good, or we can be unfaithful as we seek to find a way to get around it, ignore it or explain it away. But if we believe everything God has spoken in His Word is for our good, that it is "truth without mixture of error," inerrant, infallible, life-shaping and powerful, then we cannot avoid a single word He speaks, and must instead let it all shape our lives.

Our journey through 1 Timothy brings us to such a passage. This week, in 1 Tim 2:8-10 we will consider the calling of a man to prayer and the calling of a woman to modesty (that's the controversial part!). We'll take a break next Sunday as Pastor Warren preaches from James. But then in two weeks, we will come back to 1 Tim 2:11-15 and consider whether a woman can be a pastor.
